## HINCHINBROOK COLT MAKES NZ\$460,000 AT THE NZB READY TO RUN SALE

**Strong trade expected to continue  
at Karaka on day two**

**A**son the Yarraman Park-based stallion Hinchinbrook (Fastnet Rock) was sold for NZ\$460,000 at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale at Karaka, one of 11 juveniles to realise NZ\$300,000 or more on day one.

The Regal Farm-consigned colt, who was catalogued as **Lot 106**, was purchased by

the benchmark for a potential record-breaking sale for New Zealand Bloodstock.

While below the NZ\$650,000 achieved for a Sebring (More Than Ready) colt sold at the 2016 sale, the Hinchinbrook colt spearheaded an increase in the sale average and clearance rate which saw 145 two-year-olds sold, with 27 horses making NZ\$200,000 or more.

Sweetbriar Equine's David Lui said the Hinchinbrook colt, who breezed up in 10.37

seconds, fitted their criteria and was a valuable addition to their expanding thoroughbred racing portfolio.

"We have been active in Australia and now here buying for Hong Kong clients. We looked at lots of two-year-olds and we liked the pedigree of this colt very much," said Lui, who operates Sweetbriar Equine with Karl Chan.

"The Hinchinbrooks race well in Hong Kong and this one looks like he could be early. He is very athletic and will stay here and race either here in New Zealand or Australia before going up to Hong Kong."

The Hinchinbrook colt is the fifth foal of the unraced mare El Ashb (Fasliyev), who is a three-quarters sister to Miss Brown To You (Fasliyev), the dam of Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) performer and Ascot Gold Cup (Gr 1, 2m4f) winner Big Orange (Duke Of Marmalade).

He is also from the same family as Hong Kong Vase (Gr 1, 2400m) winner and three times Melbourne Cup runner-up Red Cadeaux (Cadeaux Genereux).

The colt was a tremendous pinhook result after being purchased for \$65,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale in January from the Bowness Stud draft. *Continued on page 2*

<< *Continued from page 1* Regal Farm's Kara Walters was delighted with the sale result, with their previous firsthand experiences with the progeny of Hinchinbrook proving beneficial when inspecting him as a yearling.

"We have had some experience with the Hinchinbrooks and they are good doers. This fellow was pinhooked out of the Gold Coast for \$65,000 and is a muscular, running colt," Walters said.

"He has thrived since we got him, kept improving and coped with the breeze-up very well. We would certainly like a few more like him."

The leading vendor by aggregate on day one, Regal Farm sold nine juveniles yesterday for an aggregate of NZ\$1,525,000 at an average of NZ\$169,444 and have seven two-year-olds on offer today.

Hinchinbrook, who stands for a fee of \$44,000 (inc GST), had two colts sell yesterday, with **Lot 98** making NZ\$300,000 for vendor Lyndhurst Farm.

The colt, who was purchased for \$155,000 at the Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale, is out of Downstream (Rakti), an unraced half-sister to Group One winner Above Deck (Bianconi), while this is also the same family as Saturday's Rosehill winner Glenall (Redoute's Choice).

The purchase of the top-priced lot on day one continues Sweetbriar Equine's, the Hong Kong-based enterprise's entry into the Australasian thoroughbred market.

Last month, Sweetbriar Equine also bought the highest-priced lot, a colt from the first crop of War (More Than Ready), for \$420,000 at the Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale and a Smart Missile (Fastnet Rock) colt for \$280,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast 2YOs in Training Sale.

## Savabeel's stock to the fore

The progeny of New Zealand's three-time reigning champion sire Savabeel (Zabeel) also lit up the Karaka sales ring late on day one, with two juveniles by the Waikato Stud-based stallion making more than NZ\$300,000.

Te Akau Racing's David Ellis went to NZ\$350,000 to secure **Lot 192**, a gelding from the draft of Lyndhurst Farm who is the third foal out of La Belle Epoque (Montjeu). *Continued on page 3 >>*

<< *Continued from page 2* He breezed in 10.86 and is by the same sire as Te Akau Racing's recent New Zealand 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Embellish and the Stephen McKee-trained New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Hasahalo.

The gelding will be placed with Te Akau Racing trainers Stephen Austridge and Jamie Richards, with Ellis already setting his sights on the 2019 New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) at Ellerslie with the gelding.

"He is the nicest individual I have bought at a Ready to Run sale. As I have often stated, I have a plan for every purchase and the goal for this guy is the New Zealand Derby in 16 months' time," Ellis said.

"I have bought nine on day one and I am confident that all will syndicate quite easily and quickly.

"Full credit must go to NZB who have assembled a great buying bench for a fantastic day's selling, the strongest I have seen."

Overall, Ellis's Te Akau Racing bought nine two-year-olds for an aggregate of NZ\$1,510,000 at an average of NZ\$167,777, which saw him become leading buyer on day one.

Only eight lots later, Hong Kong owner Eric Wong went to NZ\$310,000 for **Lot 200**, a Kilmore Farm-consigned colt by Savabeel.

Breezing up in 11.21 seconds, the colt had been purchased by Loburn Farm for NZ\$140,000 at the NZB Premier Yearling Sale this year from the now Australian-based vendor Lime Country Thoroughbreds.

He is out of city-winning mare La Praline (Anabaa) who won four races and is a half-sister to Group Three-winning sprinter and now Queensland-

based stallion Golden Archer (Rock Of Gibraltar) and stakes-placed Neapolitan (Denman).

The Savabeel colt is La Praline's second foal, with her first a three-year-old by Redoute's Choice (Danahill) who made NZ\$160,000 at the 2016 NZB Premier Yearling Sale.

"I bought him in partnership with Eric Wong, along with lots 126 and 150," bloodstock agent Chris McNulty told ANZ Bloodstock News.

<< *Continued from page 3* "He is a standout, a physical beast, very imposing but with a great nature. I was attracted to the speed represented in the blood on his dam's side.

"He will spend two months here then we will evaluate whether to race him in Australia or take him straight to Hong Kong."

McAnulty and Wong also purchased a More Than Ready (Southern Halo) colt, catalogued as **Lot 126**, from Prima Park for NZ\$200,000 and **Lot 150**, a colt by Dream Ahead (Diktat) from the Kilgravin Lodge draft of NZ\$90,000.

Savabeel, who had two juveniles sell yesterday for an average of NZ\$330,000, has a pair two-year-olds on offer today, **Lot 336** from the Windsor Park Stud draft and **Lot 415** from the Riversley Park draft.

## Fastnet Rock sets ring alight

Lindsay Park will train the brother to dual Group Two-winning and Group One-placed stablemate Formality after the agent Mark Pilkington secured the son of Fastnet Rock (Danhill) for NZ\$400,000 yesterday.

Catalogued as **Lot 174** and consigned by Curraghmore, the colt is out of former Singapore Horse of the Year Jolie's Shinju (Jolie's Halo), whose four foals to race are all winners including Formality, who won the Silver Shadow Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) and the Furious Stakes (Gr 2, 1200m) last campaign.

The juvenile was not offered as a yearling and he breezed up in 10.43 seconds.

"I bought him on behalf of David Hayes because he has the sister, Formality," Pilkington said.

"His breeze up was good and the stable have had great success with the Fastnet Rocks. This colt has a nice action by a perennial champion sire. It's a lot of money but you can spend that on a yearling easily."

Trained by David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig, Formality had her last start in the Coolmore Stud Stakes (registered as Ascot Vale Stakes) (Gr 1, 1200m) at Flemington on 4 November, finishing third to another son of the Coolmore shuttler in Merchant Navy (Fastnet Rock).

Fastnet Rock finished the day as the leading sire by average (three or more sold), with three lots sold at an average of NZ\$203,333.

Successful day for Lyndhurst and Smart Missile

The popularity this year at Australasian juvenile sales of progeny by Arrowfield-based stallion Smart Missile, a son of Fastnet Rock, continued at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready to Run Sale yesterday, with a gelding by the sire making NZ\$350,000.

The Lyndhurst Farm-consigned lot, who was passed in at the NZB Premier Yearling Sale earlier this year, was one of five juveniles sold by the leading vendor yesterday.

Catalogued as **Lot 80**, the gelding was purchased by Hong Kong-based George Moore Bloodstock, his only purchase on day one.

The two-year-old breezed up in 10.78 seconds last month and is the second foal out of twice-winning Encosta De Lago (Fairy King) mare Cyclone Stacey.

His second dam, the unraced Princess Stacey (End Sweep), as a half-sister to T J Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner and sire Master Of Design (Redoute's Choice) and South African Grade One winner Suntagonal (Octagonal).

At the close of trade on day one, Lyndhurst Farm had sold five two-year-olds for an aggregate of NZ\$1,430,000 at an average of NZ\$286,000 and finished the day as the leading vendors by average.

## Group One-winning trainers strike early with Tavistock

Expatriate New Zealand trainers Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young have turned to proven Cambridge Stud stallion Tavistock (Montjeu) in a bid to find their next racetrack star.

The emerging training partnership, based at Cranbourne in Victoria, yesterday outlaid NZ\$300,000 for a son of Tavistock, who is by the same sire as their Australian Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) winner Tavago.

The Ohukia Lodge-consigned two-year-old, catalogued as **Lot 10**, is a half-brother to Group Three winner Allez Eagle (Guillotine) and three further winners.

Passed in for NZ\$150,000 at the NZB Premier Yearling Sale from the Henley Park draft earlier this year, the colt breezed up in 11.56 seconds at Te Rapa last month.

"You know when you are going after quality horses like this colt you are going to have to go a little extra to get them," Busuttin said.

"His breeze up was terrific and he looks the type that has good speed to compliment a very strong pedigree. By what we have seen I think he could be suited to the shorter distances, although you never can tell until you get them up and going."

Busuttin said the colt, who has been bought for a Melbourne-based client, reminded him of Tavago.

"The first thing I thought was he was a replica of Tavago, in both his looks and his action," he said.

"He comes from a good staying family and I would expect that is where his future will lie."

At last year's sale, Busuttin paid NZ\$150,000 for Main Stage (Reliable Man), who has won two of his seven starts, including the UCI Stakes (registered as Super Impose Plate) (Listed, 1800m) on 7 October at Flemington and was last seen finishing fifth in the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) earlier this month.

Jamie Beatson of Ohukia Lodge said: "We thought he'd make a little bit but we didn't have a reserve. He will get every chance with Trent (Busuttin).

"He also did his breeze up under a hold, which told us something."

Another Tavistock colt, presented by Anzac Lodge as **Lot 165**, was sold for NZ\$375,000 later on day one.

<< *Continued from page 5* The colt, who breezed up in 10.63 seconds, is out of unraced mare Indian Song (Indian Danehill) and is from the family of dual Group One winner Love Dance (Kaaftad), the dam of Listed winners See The World (Danzero), Handfast (Street Cry) and Rusambo (Elusive Quality).

He had been purchased for NZ\$77,500 at the NZB Select Yearling Sale earlier this year by Anzac Lodge from the Millfield Stud draft and Anzac Lodge's Dean Hawthorne said that he had expected the horse to sell well, but did not expect him to break the NZ\$300,000 barrier.

"I didn't expect \$375,000. I knew he was an exceptional Tavistock but somewhere in the \$200,000s is where I had him," Hawthorne told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"Clearly, some good judges know more than I do. It is pleasing to see buyers come here to buy the kind of stock that we New Zealanders excel at producing, slow-maturing middle distance runners."

Hong Kong-based bloodstock agent Willie Leung said the colt would be sent to Hong Kong eminently.

"He will go straight to Hong Kong to be trained by Me Tsui. I want him to have plenty of time to acclimatise," Leung said.

"The quality of the lots is very high this year. I have some more to look at tomorrow but the competition is high."

Tavistock had seven juveniles sell yesterday for an aggregate of NZ\$1,290,000 and an average of NZ\$184,285.

## Son of Snitzel headed to Hong Kong

Hong Kong trainer Dennis Yip had one horse picked out from the catalogue, was the first horse he inspected when arriving at the Karaka complex and yesterday was able to secure the Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) colt for NZ\$250,000.

Consigned by Diamond Lodge as **Lot 53**, the gelding was purchased by Enigma Farm and Riversley Park for NZ\$130,000 at the NZB Premier Yearling Sale from the Seaton Park draft earlier this year.

Breezing up in a time of 10.28 seconds, he is the seventh foal out of Group Three placegetter Cape Princess (Cape Cross) and a half-brother to the stakes-placed Fashion Princess (Ifraaj).

"He is by a sire who is doing well in Hong Kong and we liked what we saw when he breezed up," Yip said.

"As soon as I got to Karaka I went and inspected him and I've been back a few times as well.

"He looks a very athletic type with good muscle although he is a little on the small side. That doesn't worry me as he is a November foal, so he has plenty of time to grow before we get serious with him."

Yip said the horse would continue to spend time in New Zealand before heading up to Hong Kong in June next year.

Another horse destined for Hong Kong is **Lot 61**, a colt by former Coolmore Stud shuttler Declaration Of War (War Front), who was sold to trainer Ricky Yiu for NZ\$280,000.

Consigned by JK Farm as agent, the colt had been purchased by The Robt Dawe Agency at this year's NZB Select Yearling Sale for NZ\$55,000.

The half-brother to Listed winner Speech Craft (Oratorio) had breezed up in 10.72 seconds at Te Rapa.

"He is a nice, well balanced colt who will go up to Hong Kong at the beginning of next season," said Dean Hawkes for Yiu.

"We won't rush him. The Kelsos will get him ready after a short break from here."

A Pins (Snippets) gelding, who was prepared by Leanach Lodge as **Lot 139**, will also be sent to Hong Kong after being bought for NZ\$350,000.

It was a good result for Leanach Lodge, who had purchased the now gelding from Waikato Stud at the NZB Select Yearling Sale for NZ\$100,000 earlier this year.

## Patience pays off for vendors

Meanwhile a decision to give a colt by Vinery Stud's second season sire All Too Hard (Casino Prince) time to mature, rather than sell him as a yearling, paid off for vendor Westbury Stud yesterday.

Catalogued as **Lot 4**, the Gerry Harvey-bred colt is by the same sire as recent stakes-winning three-year-olds All Too Huiying and Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) winner Villermont.

Early on day one of the NZB Ready to Run Sale, the half-brother to Listed-placed Wroclaw (Big Brown) was bought by Macau-based Frontier for NZ\$260,000.

<< *Continued from page 6* "He was a late foal who was never offered as a yearling, which meant he suited this sale, needing time to show himself," Westbury Stud's Russell Warwick told ANZ Bloodstock News.

"He's a nice type who came on well recently. The reserve was very realistic and he exceeded that easily. Everyone is happy."

Later on day one, owners Nick Fairweather and Nicole Brown had to be patient before gaining a return on with their weanling pinhook when the Tavistock two-year-old sold for NZ\$260,000 to Blue Sky Bloodstock.

Consigned by Kiltannon Stables on behalf of Fairweather and Brown, the colt was purchased privately as a weanling before being passed in at the 2017 NZB Premier Yearling Sale with a reserve of NZ\$140,000 placed on him.

Catalogued as **Lot 92**, the colt is the second foal out of the placed mare Diva Down Under (Exceed And Excel), herself a half-sister to New Zealand Group Three winner Gobi Ranger (Tale Of The Cat).

"We bought him as a weanling out of the paddock from the breeder and we took him through the yearling sales. He was very weak and immature and it probably came up a bit too soon for him," Fairweather said.

"We liked the horse so much and you generally find those nice young foals come back around for you, so we are happy he came up in time for the Ready to Runs.

"He has just thrived since being with Mark Forbes at Kiltannon Stables and he has gone from strength to strength. He's improved since he's come up here and that showed with the high interest in him, so we're very happy with the result."

Blue Sky Bloodstock's Julian Blaxland bought five two-year-olds on day one including two in partnership with Gai Waterhouse Racing, a Bachelor Duke (Miswaki) colt for NZ\$55,000 and Reliable Man colt for NZ\$310,000 from the Phoenix Park draft.

## NZB delighted with day one success

With a smaller catalogue in 2017, the average and aggregate both increased on the 2016 NZB Ready to Run Sale of 2YOs, with 145 horses selling for a total of NZ\$15,690,500, up from NZ\$14,610,500 in 2016.

The average was NZ\$108,210, up from NZ\$101,462 last year, with the clearance rate on day one closing at 75 per cent, a significant increase on the 57 per cent achieved in 2016. The median was down slightly from NZ\$70,000 last year to NZ\$65,000 in 2017.

"NZB are delighted after day one and expect the sale to continue strongly," NZB director of business development Mike Kneebone told ANZ Bloodstock News last night.

"The buyers took an hour or so to settle in then after that things were very steady. Like most sales, the buyers know what they want and the best presented lots are in the most demand.

"It was great seeing the strength from the auctioneers box."

The Australian buying bench proved a vital contributor to yesterday's results, purchasing 50 horses for a total amount of NZ\$5,302,500, while Hong Kong accounted for 32 per cent of sales, taking home 24 horses for an aggregate of NZ\$5,063,000.

Day two starts with Lot 221 at 11am local time today.

## Australia

### First for Dawn Approach

The James Cummings-trained Gongs (2 f ex Belcentra by Bel Esprit) made an impressive debut over 1100 metres at Canterbury yesterday and in the process provided Darley shuttler Dawn Approach (New Approach) with his first winner in Australia. The two-year-old filly came into the race having won her 900 metre barrier trial at the same track and yesterday she proved too good for her rivals when she beat Granny Red Shoes (Not A Single Doubt) by five and a half lengths with a head back to Perfect Pitch (Pierro) in third. First season sire Dawn Approach stands at Darley Kelvinside for \$22,000 (inc GST).

### Gongs a possible Slipper contender

After the Godolphin-raced Gongs win at Canterbury yesterday trainer James Cummings said he believed she had improved since her barrier trial and could emerge in times as possible candidate for the Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Randwick next autumn. "You love to see a two-year-old that can begin like that and show brilliant speed after two or three strides to lead comfortably," Cummings said. "She was just in a different postcode. She's an exciting filly for the team and I think we might be able to find a nice race for her next year. There's no doubt she's really improved a furlong since then. She's been able to absorb some really good, strong training."

### McLean issues Black Heart Bart's rivals a warning

Darren Weir's stable foreman Jarrod McLean yesterday issued a warning to Black Heart Bart's (Blackfriars) rivals ahead of his assault on Saturday's Railway Stakes (Gr 1, 1600m) at Ascot. The seven-year-old gelding will be ridden by Brad Rawiller as he bids to secure a sixth victory at the highest level. "I think we are going to see him at his best," McLean told Tabradio's The Sports Daily. "We haven't seen him at his best all spring, but he is pain free and it won't be fitness that beats him. When he is pain free he is dominant and I'm pretty confident we have got him back to that level."

### Allen seeking Ballarat Cup win

Jockey Ben Allen is hoping to land his first Ballarat Cup (Listed, 2200m) when he partners Mr Garcia (Paco Boy), who will be having his first run for Darren Weir. The imported gelding made an immediate impression in Australia when he won the Twitter Trophy Handicap (1800m) at Flemington on 9 November while in the care of German trainer Andreas Wohler. "I ran second in it last year on Scherzoso for trainer Tony McEvoy, so hopefully I can go one better this year," Allen said. "I haven't had a good look at the race yet but I remember watching the horse win at Flemington and it was a good win. Stepping up to the 2200 metres looks an ideal step up."

### Henderson happy with pair's draw

OTI Racing's Terry Henderson's confidence of the syndicate landing another Saturday stakes race increased when he learned Grey Lion (Galileo) had drawn three in the Ballarat Cup and Tom Melbourne (Dylan Thomas) will start from barrier one in the Railway Stakes at Ascot on Saturday. "Tom Melbourne can be a puller, but can also come out of the gates well and he might even lead," Henderson told Racing.com. "Over the mile, he's so fit

he should be able to do that. You wouldn't give up the barrier because he could be two back on the fence and pulling his head off." Henderson was equally delighted with Grey Lion's draw: "He needs it this horse as he's a little one-dimensional at this stage but over the 2200 metres from that draw, he'd be hard to beat I would have thought."

### Three for Cumani in Clockwise Classic

Trainer Matt Cumani said he is happy that all three of his runners have made the field for the Magic Millions 2YO Clockwise Classic (1000m) at Ballarat on Saturday. However he was left lamenting the barrier draw for Akkadian (Nicconi), who he rates as the stables best chance, after he drew barrier 15 and is likely to jump from the outside barrier if the emergencies do not gain a start. Cumani's other runners are Malawi Gold (Smart Missile) and Anthemoessa (Smart Missile), who have drawn barriers nine and three respectively. "It's great to get them all in but unfortunately our best chance has got a terrible barrier," Cumani said. He really needed a good barrier. It's going to make it a little bit more difficult but we'll still take our chance.

### Newnham's Star on the rise

Trainer Mark Newnham is confident Star Sensation's (Star Witness) upward trajectory can continue when she lines up in a Benchmark 71 (1400m) at Rosehill on Saturday. The three-year-old filly comes into the race having taken out her previous two starts at Canterbury and Randwick and Newnham believes she is still improving. "She is going super. She has improved each run and probably just needed it first up. She won a nice little race at Canterbury then beat older mares and won with a bit of authority. I'd say she has improved again since then and will be suited at the 1400 metres," said Newnham. "The idea was to get her through to Saturday class. She is there now and has a bit of weight but on her last run, it's probably warranted."

## Test The Word to Rosehill

Trainer Bjorn Baker has made no secret that he thinks a lot of Test The World (Testa Rossa) and he will be hoping she can make a winning return to the track when she takes her chance in a Benchmark 80 (1100m) at Rosehill. The mare has won five of her eight starts and has not been seen since running second in the Schweppes Handicap (1400m) at Randwick on 24 June. "I think she can be a black-type filly in time. The penny hasn't really dropped with her," Baker's stable foreman Jack Bruce said. "It's just a matter of when she mentally turns the corner."

## Monsieur Gustave makes winning return in Keith Noud

The Darryl Hansen-trained Monsieur Gustave (5g Al Maher - Saigon Moonlight, by Stravinsky) picked up where he left off last preparation with an all-the-way win of the rescheduled Keith Noud Handicap (Listed, 1200m) at Ipswich yesterday. Apprentice Tiffani Brooker made it two rides for two wins on Monsieur Gustave, who beat Upstart Pride (Tycoon Ruler) by three lengths with a neck to Brooklyn Storm (Hinchinbrook) in the race, which was switched from a washed-out Doomben on Saturday.

## Big targets for Monsieur Gustave

Following Monsieur Gustave's victory in the Keith Noud Handicap yesterday, trainer Darryl Hansen said he will now press on to the George Moore Stakes (Gr 3, 1200m) at Doomben on 2 December. "In a way when the race was washed out on Saturday, it was a help for us. It gave him a couple of extra days to get over his jump out the previous Tuesday," Hansen said. "He will go on to the big races in the summer, starting with

the George Moore Stakes and then the Lough Neagh Stakes and Buffering Quality. There is a \$400,000 bonus on the treble, which would be nice." Hansen also revealed that the gelding could then press on to the Magic Millions carnival in January.

## Back-to-back wins for Doukhan

The Kris Lees-trained Doukhan (Dansili) secured back-to-back wins when he scored a fine victory in a Benchmark 75 (2700m) at Canterbury yesterday. The Australian Bloodstock, Chalkboard, Power Thoroughbreds and Cinque Terrors co-owned eight-year-old gelding snapped a losing streak on his last appearance at Randwick that stretched back to June 2015 and yesterday he continued that winning thread when beating Goodwood Zodiac (Kodiac) by a neck with another three quarters of a length back to Wine Bush (High Chaparral) in third. "He's had two lots of 12 months sitting around the paddock so it's good to get a couple of wins," Lees said. "He won't reach the level we were expecting but he's a nice handy stayer."

## Taddei Tondo could be retired

Gerard Moloney said on Monday that he had come to the decision that Taddei Tondo (Danerich) had run his last race, however he had a rethink after the deadline for entries was extended for the Le Pine Funerals Handicap (1300m) at Sandown Lakeside because of a small field. The decision to give the eight-year-old gelding an entry proved an inspired one when he defeated Macattack (Street Boss) by a neck with just over a length back to See Me Fly (Sebring) in third. "On Monday morning I virtually said that's it, we'll retire him," Moloney said. "They called for more acceptances for the race and I thought he's only got to come over to Sandown, so I accepted with him. We won't make a decision on his future today but I'd be happy for him to finish off on that note."

## Hawkes rates Sandown pair

Co-trainer Wayne Hawkes believes the pair of three-year-olds that provided the stable with a double at Sandown Lakeside yesterday are

destined for bigger targets. Sinjaree (O'Reilly), winner of the Moorookyle Park Plate (1400m) and Echo Jet (Hinchinbrook), who took out the Chandler MacLeod Handicap (1200m) will now likely be aimed at stakes company. "It was a good, gutsy effort," Hawkes said of Sinjaree. "Putting the blinkers on him has certainly helped and what is not shown in the race book is he broke the class record at Newcastle last time. Maybe he shouldn't have been an \$8 chance."

## Bright future for Justify

Despite Justify (Exceed And Excel) successfully breaking his maiden on debut at Ipswich yesterday, trainer Tony Gollan is confident that he still has a lot of improving to do. The three-year-old came into the race having won all three of his barrier trials and yesterday he showed the same class when he beat Madam Mahal (Starcraft) by a short-head with another length and three quarters back to Snow Sparkle (More Than Ready) in third. "It got a bit hairy in the last 50 metres but he has won and that is the main thing. Justify is a lot better than that. Maybe the soft track didn't suit him or he led so easily he thought his job was done," Gollan said. "I think you will see a much better horse in the future." Justify's win provided Gollan with a double on the card after Prue's Angel's (Sequalo) victory in the Class Two Handicap (1020m).

## Record first acceptances for Blue Diamond

More than 700 juveniles remain paid up for this season's Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Caulfield on 24 February after first acceptances for Victoria's biggest two-year-old race were released yesterday. The \$1,500,000 million race in February attracted 1470 nominations in July and 706 horses remain for the 1200 metre race. The Lindsay Park stable of trainers David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig still have 77 horses entered as they bid to win the race for the second-straight year after the success of Catchy (Fastnet Rock) last season. Trainer Tony McEvoy and the stable of Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott each have 46 horses still entered after first acceptances were taken on Tuesday, Aaron Purcell has 38 and Mick Price and Hawkes Racing each have 34. The next round of acceptances are taken on 9 January.

## The Quarterback retired

Group One-winning sprinter The Quarterback (Street Boss) has been retired after two disappointing runs this campaign. The winner of the 2016 Newmarket Handicap (Gr 1, 1200m), The Quarterback finished last at his past two starts on the straight course at Flemington and both times was found to have an exercise-induced pulmonary haemorrhage. Cranbourne-based trainer Robbie Griffiths said he and the owners had decided it was in the best interests of the horse to call time on his racing career. "It is not only with great sadness but also delight for what lies ahead for Griffiths Racing's sensational sprinter The Quarterback," Griffiths said on his website. "Griffiths Racing together with the owners and connections have reached the decision that has seen our champion and headline horse retired."

## Plans unveiled for Moonee Valley redevelopment

The Moonee Valley track looks set to be rebuilt and reoriented and a new grandstand will be constructed following the running of the 2020 Cox Plate (Gr 1, 2040m). The plans are part of a \$2,000,000,000 vision for the Moonee Valley Racing Club (MVRC), which will also include apartments. Money from the residential land sales will go towards funding the redevelopment. Following the rebuild, the MVRC wants to become an exclusive night racing venue, which will include running the Cox Plate under lights. The short home straight will be extended from 173 metres to 317 metres and widened to 30 metres.

## New Zealand

### Somethingvain to Breeders' Stakes

After finishing second in the Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes (Gr 2, 1400m) last season, Somethingvain (Falkirk) will be looking to go one better when she takes her chance in Saturday's renewal of the Group Two. "We're doing exactly the same with her as we did last year – one run and then this one a month later," said co-trainer Michael Rogers, who trains with his brother Matthew and their father Matt. "She's come back really well and she's strengthened up with a spell. "She has progressed nicely and she's in very good order, we're pretty happy. If she wins we would have a crack at the Railway, if not then we would be looking at the Listed Newmarket and then the Westbury Classic."

### Dennis ponders Group One options

Stablemates The Lustre (Darci Brahma) and The Sparkle (Darci Brahma), who finished third and fourth respectively in last Saturday's New Zealand 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) could now be aimed at the Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) at Trentham on 13 January. "I was rapt with them, over the moon and to be fair it wasn't a surprise as we knew they had the ability," said Robert Dennis, who is now part of the family's Southland training operation. "They are having a couple of weeks in the paddock and we've nominated them for the Levin Classic, but whether we go down that path has yet to be decided." Dennis also said they were seriously

considering targeting the pair at the New Zealand Oaks (Gr 1, 2400m).

### Angel In Bluejeans to Pukekohe

The Margaret Falconer-trained Angel In Bluejeans (Mastercraftsman) will step out in Saturday's Mount Shop Handicap (2400m) at Pukekohe, a race she will use as a stepping stone towards the Waikato Cup (Gr 3, 2400m) at Te Rapa on 16 December. "She's been quite a tricky mare and that's why she went down to Jonathan and Trina Riddell," Falconer said. "She wasn't going in the gates and it was just inexperience. She's older now and she's got her confidence up. When Jonathan and Trina came up to Cambridge the mare came back to us and she's going really well."

## Asia

### Stormy Liberal supplemented for Sprint

The Peter Miller-trained Grade One winner Stormy Liberal (Stormy Atlantic) has been supplemented for the Hong Kong Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) at Sha Tin on 10 December. The five-year-old gelding was last seen running out a shock winner of the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (Gr 1, 5f) on 4 November and was the only supplementary entry for the HK\$18,500,000 race yesterday.

At the time of going to press, a sister to recent Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) runner-up Johannes Vermeer (Galileo) was topping the third day of the Goffs November Foal Sale after Hugo Lascelles went to €1,100,000 to secure filly from the Castlebridge Consignment. The filly, who was catalogued as **Lot 541**, is

out of Inca Princess (Holy Roman Emperor) also making her a sister to Group Two winner Elizabeth Browning, who was purchased for 700,000 guineas at the recent Tattersalls Horses in Training Sale. "She's for American interests and will almost certainly be kept to race in England," said Lascelles. "The mare's first foal was a Group 1 winner and her second, Elizabeth Browning, won the Kilboy Estate. The mare is proven and this was a very, very good looking filly."

### Colt out of Melito makes €625,000

A colt out of Australian dual Group One-winning mare Melito (Redoute's Choice) realised €625,000 at the Goffs November Foal Sale yesterday after Ken Bolger fought off strong competition from American agent Gatewood Bell to take the foal home. Catalogued as **Lot 569** and sold by the Castlebridge Consignment on behalf of Coolmore and the China Horse Club the colt's dam is also a half-sister to the

dam of San Domenico Stakes (Gr 3, 1100m) winner Pariah (Redoute's Choice). "He's a grand colt," said Bolger. "Obviously we know a lot about Galileo - he's been very lucky for us - and obviously it's a good page. We'll bring him back with a view to racing him down the line." There will be a full report of all the action from day three of the Goffs November Foal Sale in tomorrow's edition of ANZ.

### Daughter of Dabirsim makes €70,000



## €260,000 Australia colt steals the show at November Sale

A half-brother to the exciting Sarrocchi (Galileo) dominated proceedings during a strong second session of the Goffs November Foal Sale on Tuesday, selling for €260,000 to pinhooker Philip Stauffenberg.

The son of Australia (Galileo), who was catalogued as **Lot 430**, was offered by Garranlea Stud on behalf of Rockhart Trading and the China Horse Club, who bred the colt out of Listed winner Thai Haku (Oasis Dream), herself a 650,000 guineas purchase through Eaton Sales for current connections at Tattersalls in 2012.

"He's been bought for a new client," said Stauffenberg. "He'll probably be kept to race rather than come back for resale. I thought Australia produced some really good-looking stock this year, and it will be interesting to see how they do on the track."

Only last month, this colt's half-sister Sarrocchi was knocked down to Fozzy Stack for a sale-topping €215,000 at the Goffs Horses in Training Sale; then unraced, she reappeared several days later in a Leopardstown maiden under Coolmore ownership and proceeded to

justify strong market support for Aidan O'Brien with an authoritative winning debut.

Garranlea Stud also provided the second most expensive foal of the day, **Lot 489**, a colt from the first crop of Gleneagles (Galileo) who was snapped up by Flash Conroy of Glenvale Stud for €150,000.

Another bred by Rockhart Trading and the China Horse Club, he is out of the winning Convocate, a winning Exchange Rate (Danzig) half-sister to French Group Three winner Dance Dress (Nureyev).

"The stallion is very exciting," said Conroy after outbidding Gay O'Callaghan. "He's getting good stock - they're well balanced, quality horses and good movers. So I'm very happy to get this foal."

Thai Haku and Convocate are also set to come under the hammer themselves when the mares sale gets underway on Thursday.

### €135,000 Exceed colt to Tally-Ho

The sale of the Australia colt marked the highlight of a day which featured seven six-figure foals and a healthy average price

of €35,313, 20 per cent ahead of last year's corresponding figure.

Tally-Ho Stud ended day one as leading buyer as the purchaser of close to €300,000 worth of stock and they continued to reinvest in a strong way on Tuesday to bring their expenditure to almost €700,000.

Heading their purchases was **Lot 409**, an Exceed And Excel (Danehill) colt from Baroda & Colbinstown Studs, who provided a home run for connections when realising €135,000. Mick Flanagan paid €50,000 for the colt's dam Sound The Alarm, a Compton Place (Indian Ridge) sister to Irish 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) runner-up Shifting Power, at the Goffs November Mares' Sale last year.

"Mick Flanagan bought the dam on behalf of a new client here last year," said David Cox of Baroda & Colbinstown Studs. "He did 143 shows, which just goes to show the popularity of good foals, and there were plenty of vets."

He added: "We've managed to buy a couple ourselves but it's a very strong market."

### Gutaifan the buzz horse

There has been a real buzz surrounding the first crop of Gutaifan (Dark Angel) since the breeding stock sales season opened at Tattersalls Ireland earlier in the month and that continued into Tuesday's session, with the son of Dark Angel (Acclamation) accounting for two of the 12 lots to sell for €90,000 or more.

Leading the way was **Lot 352**, a colt offered by Ballylinch Stud out of Oh Sedulous (Lawman), an unraced relation to Shirocco (Monsun) who realised €120,000 to Gutaifan's home of Yeomanstown Stud.

"We thought this colt was the best individual of the day, regardless of the sire, and he's bred on a good cross," said Yeomanstown's David O'Callaghan, alluding to the fact that the colt represents a variation of the nick responsible for Battaash (Dark Angel). "He also has a bit of pedigree behind him."

"Gutaifan has a strong group of foals to represent him here. They're a good stamp - good movers who look like they'll run."

A half-sister to this season's King Charles II Stakes (Listed, 7f) winner Taamol (Helmet) from Skara Stud was another by Gutaifan to catch the eye, selling for €90,000 to Mick Flanagan.

## Powerstown syndicate lands a touch

It has been a productive week on the buying front for Tom and Alexandra Whitehead of Powerstown Stud, but the pair also enjoyed a good result of their own in the sale ring as the vendor of a colt by Aquis Farm shuttler Holy Roman Emperor (Danehill) that sold for €120,000.

Peter O'Callaghan, who is at the helm of Woods Edge Farm in Kentucky, signed for the colt who was bred by a syndicate at Powerstown Stud out of Laqataat, an Alhaarth (Unfuwain) mare bought through the BBA Ireland for €55,000 in 2015.

"I think there will be a lot of happy people - his sale was a positive surprise," said Alexandra Whitehead following the sale. "Unfortunately a lot of them couldn't be here today.

"Tom picked out the mare at the sale. It's a lovely family and I thought she'd done herself well at stud at the time [as the dam of four winners]. She's a big mare who needs a smaller horse so it worked out well. He's always been a nice foal, very straightforward with a lovely temperament."

Catalogued as **Lot 303**, he is the eighth foal out of the mare, a member of the famous Fall

Aspen family whose four winners include the Group Three-placed Nasseem Sea (Bahri).

On what was a strong morning in the ring for Holy Roman Emperor, the Coolmore stallion was also to the fore as the sire of a colt who sold to Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock for €105,000, who was catalogued as **Lot 287**.

Sold by River Downes Stud, he is a half-brother to this season's dual-winning juvenile Billy Dylan (Excelebration) and out of

a half-sister to dual Group Two winner Kahal (Machiavellian).

"He's a smasher of a colt," said Brown. "I loved his yearling half-brother when he came up for sale at Doncaster. He made £95,000 and he's gone to John Gosden, so there's that working for you. And obviously this colt is by a very good stallion with international appeal, particularly in Hong Kong."

## Three-year-olds - Season Review

### O'Brien Guineas dominance continues

Aidan O'Brien's recent stranglehold on the 2,000 and 1,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) at Newmarket, the first two Classics of the European season, continued in May as Churchill (Galileo) and surprise package Winter (Galileo) gave their record-breaking trainer the perfect start to 2017.

**Churchill**, always held in the highest esteem by O'Brien and regular jockey Ryan Moore, showed all the tenacity and grit that saw him crowned the leading juvenile in Europe in 2016 when battling to a length success over the Godolphin-raced Barney Roy (Excelebration) on 6 May.

He went on to secure the Irish 2,000 Guineas (Gr 1, 1m) in more clear cut fashion at the Curragh later that month, comfortably accounting for the subsequent Prix Jean Prat (Gr 1, 1600m) winner Thunder Snow (Helmet) for back-to-back Classics.

"He's a great horse and we're delighted with him," O'Brien said after the colt landed his fourth career Group One in the Irish 2,000 Guineas.

"He's brave and so versatile. Ground and trip all come alike to him and he has a lovely demeanour."

His stablemate **Winter** also completed the English / Irish 1,000 Guineas double, showing a sparkling turn of foot to win from off the pace at

Newmarket before she scored emphatically by four and three quarter lengths at the Curragh on 28 May.

At Deauville in France, the Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2,000 Guineas) (Gr 1, 1600m) went the way of the Jean-Claude Rouget-trained and Al Shaqab-raced **Brametot** (Rajsaman), while the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1,000 Guineas) (Gr 1, 1600m) went the way of the less-vaunted stable of Fabrice Chappet, courtesy of **Precieuse** (Tamayuz).

### Enable dominates in Oaks

The brilliant **Enable** (Nathaniel), the John Gosden-trained filly who swept all before her in 2017, kicked off a stunning run of form with a dominant victory in the Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) at Epsom.

The Juddmonte Farms-bred and raced three-year-old stormed clear of the Aidan O'Brien-trained Rhododendron (Galileo) amidst a torrential thunderstorm to score emphatically in the fillies Classic in early June.

The following day at Epsom, O'Brien

was delivered with a beautifully-timed run by Stephane Pasquier to win the €1,000,000 race.

Trainer Markus Klug enjoyed a fine season in Germany in 2017, and he saddled the high-class **Windstoss** (Shirocco) to win the Deutsches Derby (Gr 1, 2400m), while the Preis der Diana (Gr 1, 2200m) went to the Peter Schiergen-trained **Lacazar** (Adlerflug).

### Barney Roy gains revenge at Ascot

Having played second fiddle to Churchill in the 2,000 Guineas at Newmarket in May, when arguable an unlucky loser, the Richard Hannon-trained and Godolphin-raced **Barney Roy** (Excelebration) turned the tables on his rival when landing the St James's Palace Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) at Royal Ascot.

The strapping colt showed a stunning change of gear under James Doyle to land the historic Group One, won by the likes of Frankel (Galileo), Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) and

Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) since 2000, in a track record time of 1:37.22.

Coolmore and Aidan O'Brien-bounced back later in the week, saddling **Caravaggio** (Scat Daddy) to win the third running of the Commonwealth Cup (Gr 1, 6f).

The top-class colt scythed through the field under a confident Ryan Moore to run down the Godolphin-raced pair Harry Angel (Dark Angel) and Blue Point (Shamardal) in the closing stages for a thrilling victory.

"He's obviously a brilliant horse. Ryan gave him a brilliant ride and his change of pace is unbelievable. I don't think we've ever had a quicker horse," O'Brien said of the colt following the Commonwealth Cup.

The excellent **Winter**, who is out of the Royal Ascot-winning Choisir (Daneshill Dancer) mare Laddies Poker Two, added a third Group One to her tally at the Royal meeting, when landing the Coronation Stakes (Gr 1, 1m) with complete authority.

gained ample compensation when saddling outsider **Wings Of Eagles** (Pour Moi) to score a sensational victory in the Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f), the world's most prestigious three-year-old race.

The colt swooped from well off the pace to run down his stablemate Cliffs Of Moher (Galileo) at odds of 50/1 under jockey Pdraig Beggy to emulate his father and former Windsor Park shuttler Pour Moi (Montjeu), who won the Derby in 2011.

While Enable would go on to complete the Oaks / Irish Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f) double with a facile success under Frankie Dettori at the Curragh, Wings Of Eagles was forced to settle for third place behind stable companion **Capri** (Galileo) in the Irish Derby (Gr 1, 1m4f).

The colt was found to have suffered an injury in that race and was retired shortly afterwards by connections.

**Brametot** completed his own Classic double when running out an impressive winner of the Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) (Gr 1, 2100m) at Chantilly in June.

He quickened up in taking style to win going away from an unpromising position under Cristian Demuro, giving his trainer Rouget back-to-back Jockey Club victories, following the success of the brilliant Almanzor (Wootton Bassett) in 2016.

"He is a very hard horse, very strong - a true Group One horse," Demuro said after the colt's taking performance.

Meanwhile, the Prix de Diane (French Oaks) (Gr 1, 2100m) went the way of the Niarchos Family-bred and race **Senga** (Blame), who

She went on to win the Nassau Stakes (Gr 1, 1m2f) at Goodwood in August before being retired earlier this week with prize money earnings of £1,098,164.

Though defeated in the Commonwealth Cup during Royal Ascot, the Clive Cox-trained and Godolphin-raced **Harry Angel** established himself as the leading three-year-old sprinter of 2017 during a stunning campaign.

The colt led from gate to wire in both the July Cup (Gr 1, 6f) at Newmarket and the Sprint Cup (Gr 1, 6f) at Haydock, with jockey Adam Kirby full of praise following his victory in the latter Group One.

"He's a machine. He's got speed to burn and that's not how good he is, he's there now mentally and he'll keep on getting better," he said.

**O'Brien and Gosden share autumn spoils**

Aidan O'Brien and Newmarket-based John Gosden dominated the autumn feature races in Europe in 2017.

The final Classic of the British season, the St Leger Stakes (Gr 1, 1m6.5f) at Doncaster, went the way of O'Brien for a fifth time when the Irish Derby winner **Capri** outstayed his rivals to score under Ryan Moore.

The three-year-old colt was no match for champion filly **Enable** in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Gr 1, 2400m), however, as the daughter of dual Group One winner Nathaniel (Galileo) stormed to an emphatic success in Europe's richest race at Chantilly in October.

Enable added the lucrative Group One race to her impressive CV following runaway victories in the King George VI and Queen

Elizabeth Stakes (Gr 1, 1m4f) and Yorkshire Oaks (Gr 1, 1m4f).

"She's very special and she was well positioned by Frankie in order to show her sheer class and brilliance," Gosden said following her breathtaking Arc success.

"It's all about the filly and the owner-breeder Prince Khalid (Abdullah). He bred the mother and for his farm to produce something like this is exciting for us all."

Gosden has another exciting performer to look forward to next season in **Cracksman**, the son of Frankel (Galileo) who progressed steadily throughout last season.

He ended his campaign with a brilliant success in the Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 1m2f) at Ascot in October, thrashing his rivals by seven lengths and setting up the prospect of a mouth-watering clash with Enable next season.

## The Taj Mahal only needed to equal his peak rating in taking out Saturday's Zipping Classic

**T**he Taj Mahal (Galileo) [119] may have only needed to equal his peak rating in winning Saturday's Zipping Classic (registered as Sandown Classic) (Gr 2, 2400m) but the Irish-bred stayer showed sufficient to suggest that he will be effective again when he contests the autumn staying features, writes Adam Blencowe.

In a really solid performance, The Taj Mahal raced away to score impressively by three and a half lengths easily defeating his Group One winning Robert Hickmott-trained stablemate Almandin (Monsun) [112].

The runner-up Almandin rated five pounds less than his 119-rated victory in the 2016 Melbourne Cup (Gr 1, 3200m) and nine pounds less his 121+ Timeform peak taking this season in winning the JRA Trophy (Listed, 2500m) at Flemington on 16 September.

And while we did not really learn anything new about The Taj Mahal's ability on the weekend, his peak rating remaining at 119, we did get to see him use that ability to win a race - something he had done just once in 18 starts for former trainer Aidan O'Brien.

The Taj Mahal, still a three-year-old by Northern Hemisphere time, had however been placed on seven prior occasions, including a second in the Secretariat Stakes (Gr 1, 1m2f) at Arlington on 12 August.

He followed that with a fifth in the Irish Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 1m2f) at Leopardstown on 9 September when The Taj Mahal recorded his current Timeform peak of 119 for the first time.

The Taj Mahal then came to Australia and at his second start in this country, he staged a solid performance when fourth behind Tosen Stardom (Deep Impact) [122+] in the Emirates Stakes (registered as LKS Mackinnon Stakes) (Gr 1, 2000m) at Flemington on 11 November.

On Saturday, The Taj Mahal was well ridden by Ben Melham who rode him like a true stayer and it showed he clearly had the horse for the job.

He may be just three-years-old, but has already plenty of quality racecourse experience behind him and as he matures further, The Taj Mahal should know exactly how to use his talent and that makes him a really good prospect for 2018.

We saw something similar with Ace High (High Chaparral) [118] this year, who may not have won in six starts in his two-year-old season but that experience may have been what won him the Spring Champion Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) and the Victoria Derby (Gr 1, 2500m) at three.

While the James Cummings-trained colt Prized Icon (More Than Ready) [121] had a similar grounding, albeit a more successful one, before winning the 2016 Victoria Derby.

The other feature on Saturday was the Sandown Guineas (Gr 2, 1600m) where the covers came off another couple of exciting prospects for 2018.

Victory went to the Aaron Purcell-trained colt **Villermont** (All Too Hard) [111p] who scored by a head from the Darren Weir-trained colt

Peaceful State (Animal Kingdom) [111p], both being well above average maiden winners heading into the race.

Since his impressive maiden success at Ballarat in September, Villermont had finished fourth in a three-year-old Benchmark 70 at Caulfield where he paid the price for racing too close to a fast tempo.

But Luke Nolen rode him back in the field at Sandown with Villermont settling last before using his speed late in narrowly beating Peaceful State, who had raced wide.

The two lightly raced colts are now rated 111p and it will be a surprise if Villermont and Peaceful State are not able to make light of that assessment come the autumn.

Third-placed Black Sail (Savabeel) [110], also from the Aaron Purcell stable, looks smart as well, although he does not seem to have the potential of the pair that finished just in front of him.

But the Sandown Guineas was not the only race to produce a talented three-year-old over the weekend where Friday night's Moonee Valley meeting was generally of moderate class but there was nothing common about the performance of **Nature Strip** (Nicconi) [110+].

The Robert Smerdon-trained gelding won the Benchmark 70, Three-Year-Old Handicap (1000m) by five and a half lengths - going into the race rated 98p but coming out rated 110+ and a genuine contender for top-level sprinting prizes in the second half of the season.

One of the main features of the Nature Strip's win was the fast overall time of 58.05 and the colt still finished full of running, suggesting that there is plenty more to come from a horse that would be far from out of place in the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) in the near year.
