SHE WILL REIGN RETURNS WITH QUALITY BARRIER TRIAL PERFORMANCE

Ben Melham flies in to partner three-year-old in Warwick Farm hit out

Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) winner She Will Reign (Manhattan Rain) appears to have returned in good order after pleasing Gary Portelli and Ben Melham in a Warwick Farm barrier trial yesterday.

The three-year-old, who won the A J Moir Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Moonee Valley in the spring, trailed Super Too (Hinchinbrook) throughout in heat one before being kept under a tight rein by Melham in the straight.

She Will Reign finished second, one and

a quarter lengths behind the Marc Conners-trained Super Too, with Bolero King (Nicconi) another half a length away in third place in the 800 metre hit out, held on the Warwick Farm course proper.

Super Too, runner-up to Snitty Kitty (Snitzel) in the Caulfield Sprint (Gr 2, 1000m) on 21 October before being spelled, ran 46.40 seconds with her last 600 metres in 33.40 seconds on a Good 4 surface.

Portelli told ANZ Bloodstock News yesterday that he was pleased to see She Will Reign relax in behind Super Too in the barrier trial.

"You always worry if they come up and the first look at them is under trial pressure and she looked good today," Portelli said.

"The next step will be one more trial and that will have her spot on for the race at Warwick Farm on the big (Inglis Riverside Stables) opening weekend."

She Will Reign's first up run will be in the \$250,000 Inglis Sprint (1100m) at Warwick Farm on 10 February before being aimed at the Oakleigh Plate (Gr 1, 1100m) in Melbourne a fortnight later in an attempt to win her third Group One race.

Melham was also delighted with She Will Reign's barrier trial.

"She's matured and strengthened up, she's not a little girl anymore," Melham said.

"I saw her in her box a month ago and she looked fantastic. She's a bit of a funny horse, fresh in her trial, she normally jumps and wants to run a bit. But with that bunny there I could sit against her.

"It's great for her to trial this well early in her campaign when she's not ready. She's a very competitive horse and improves with every bit of work she does."

She Will Reign is expected to return to Sydney after the Oakleigh Plate for the T J Smith Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) and possibly the All Aged Stakes (Gr 1, 1400m) at Randwick during the autumn carnival. *Continued on page 2>>*

"At this stage, the plan will be to at one point stretch her out and I always thought she would (run 1400 metres) but it is just a matter of having the right program," Portelli said.

"I think a steadily run seven furlong race could suit her once she gets into her preparation."

The trainer said She Will Reign had again strengthened up during her spring spell.

"I always said that when she won the Slipper she looked like a foal. She was only 420 kilograms then but now she is 490 kilograms," he said.

"She is longer in the barrel now and is a different shape."

Portelli also revealed that his two-year-old **Secret Lady** (Choiris) had come through her Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) fifth placing in excellent condition.

The filly won the Golden Gift (1100m) at Rosehill on 25 November and could now be aimed at the Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) if she continues to please Portelli in the next couple of weeks.

"She has come through really well. She was jarred up in one shin after the race, but she has cooled down well and is straight back into her tucker," he said.

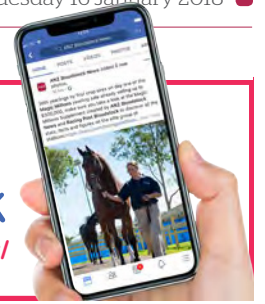
"I don't think we'll go to the Slipper. If anything, we might try and have a throw at the stumps at Caulfield in one of the lead-ups to the Blue Diamond to try and get some black type.

"That might be the option if she is screaming out at me to keep her going. Her grand final was going to be the Magic Millions, and for most horses that would be enough, but she is such a tough bugger, if any horse was able to do more than that it would be her."

Meanwhile, Portelli was ecstatic to be able to secure She Will Reign's half-brother by first season stallion Time For War (Snitzel) at last week's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale for \$325,000.

Offered by Yarraman Park Stud, the colt is the third foal out of Courgette (Charge Forward), with She Will Reign being her first, while her now two-year-old half-sister by Shamus Award (Snitzel) was sold for \$425,000 at the Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale.

"The Time For War colt is a really athletic sort of horse and there is a lot to like about him," Portelli said.

"Last year's filly was a spitting image of She Will Reign, you would have thought it was the same horse, but this fellow is a bit more scopey.

"He has a bit more length about him, he has a lighter frame and has more of a Time For War look about him. He has a walk on him and I probably would have bought the horse just on type even if he wasn't a half to She Will Reign, so that's an added bonus."

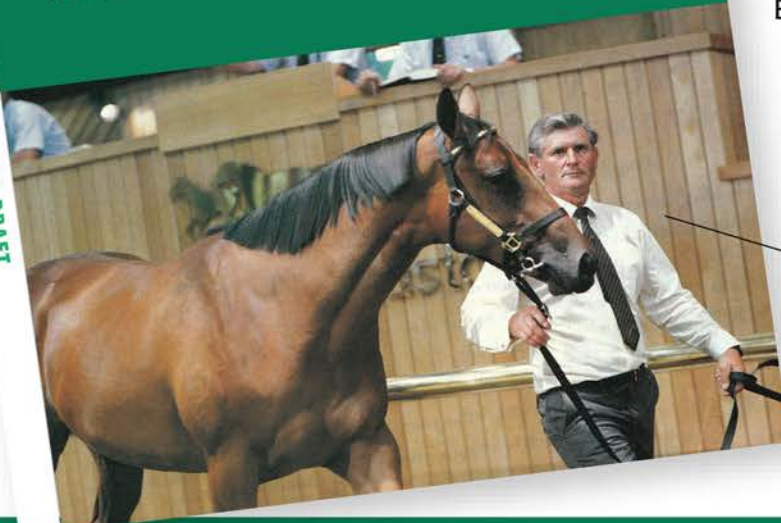

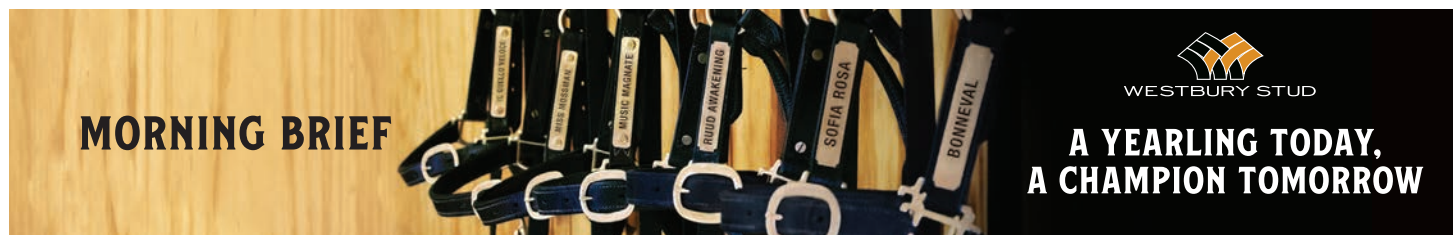

Exciting Nature Strip headed for Inglis Dash

Exciting sprinter Nature Strip (Nicconi) heads 23 nominations for the \$250,000 Inglis Dash (1100m) at Flemington on Saturday. The three-year-old, who was recently transferred to the stable of Robert Hickmott following Robert Smerdon's decision to step down pending a Racing Victoria investigation, has won three of his four starts including wide-margin victories at Moonee Valley and Sandown Hillside. The Mitchell McKenzie Stakes (Listed, 1200m) winner Overshare (I Am Invincible) has also been entered for the valuable sprint, as has the progressive Henry Dwyer-trained gelding Onehundred Percent (Hinchinbrook).

Nominations extended for Kensington Stakes

Nominations for the \$120,000 Kensington Stakes (Listed, 1000m) at Flemington on Saturday have been extended until 10am this morning after 12 initial entries were received yesterday. Co-trainers Mathew Ellerton and Simon Zahra have three horses nominated for the Listed sprint, including three-time Group One winner Flamberge (Exceed And Excel), who could bid to gain his first win since the 2016 William Reid Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m). Robbie Laing has nominated the high-class Lord Of The Sky (Danerich), while multiple Group Two winner Saracino (Per Incanto) has also been given an entry.

Two Flemington options for Miss Wonderland

Trainer David Brideoake is weighing up two options at Flemington this weekend for the lightly raced Miss Wonderland (Snitzel). The four-year-old mare finished eighth having raced keenly in the Standish Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) at her last start, and she could run in either the Kensington Stakes or a Benchmark

84 (1200m). "I'm not 100 per cent sure where we're going yet," Brideoake said. "I'm keen to see what her work is like in the morning and then we'll go from there. I thought she over-raced in the Standish. We'll give her a shot again and hopefully her racing manners are a bit better." [Click here](#) to view Saturday's Flemington nominations.

Portelli juveniles to run at Randwick

Warwick Farm-based Gary Portelli will be hoping to unearth two potential Golden Slipper Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) contenders when he saddles recent barrier trial winners Dio D'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro) and Patron Black (Patronize) in Saturday's two-year-old plate (1000m) at Randwick. "They are two nice colts and both are barrier trial winners," Portelli said. "Dio D'Oro is going to be a lovely three-year-old but he trialed nicely at Warwick Farm so we'll see how he goes. Patron Black looks to have plenty of ability and I'm looking forward to seeing what he can do." [Click here](#) to view Saturday's Randwick nominations.

Veterans chase second Gosford Cup

Destiny's Kiss (Power Of Destiny) and Red Excitement (Excites), the past two winners of the Gosford Gold Cup (Listed, 2100m), head the weights for Thursday's \$150,000 feature. The Joe Pride-trained Destiny's Kiss, who took out the Listed race in 2016, will carry 61 kilograms while last year's victor Red Excitement has been allotted 60.5 kilograms. "I hadn't seen him for eight days and he looks terrific," trainer Gerald Ryan said of Red Excitement. "He's really well in himself. It's a big weight to carry but what you'd expect." Persian Empire remains on NZ Derby path

A tilt at the New Zealand Derby (Gr 1, 2400m) on 3 March is still under consideration for

the Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young-trained Persian Empire (Savabeel), who is set to continue his preparation over 1600 metres at Caulfield tomorrow. "It's certainly on the radar," Busuttin said. "He's got to step up in his next couple of starts but if he can run well on Wednesday, there's a 2040-metre race at Moonee Valley he'll go towards. If he could win a race like that we would probably pop him on the plane and head over to New Zealand." [Click here](#) to view Wednesday's Caulfield acceptances.

McEvoy targets Diamond with juveniles

Tony McEvoy harbours Blue Diamond Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) aspirations for the Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum-owned juveniles Run Naan (Makfi), Oohood (I Am Invincible), Roobeena (Exceed And Excel) and Al Naifa (Redoute's Choice). The quartet were put through their paces at Werribee jump outs yesterday morning. "Run Naan was very good; he was cruising around behind them. He's coming along nicely. He's going to go to the Preview and the Prelude," McEvoy told Racing.com. "Oohood tried really nicely, as did Roobeena and Al Naifa, they're three quality juveniles."

Randwick Guineas aim for Pierata

Fresh from landing a \$1,700,000 payday in the Magic Millions 3YO Guineas (RL, 1400m), trainer Greg Hickman is planning a Group One campaign with the high-class Pierata (Pierro). The colt has improved throughout his preparation and could be aimed at races such as the Randwick Guineas (Gr 1, 1600m) in the coming months. "I think he can do anything, this horse. He thinks he's pretty good at the moment," Hickman told Sky Sports Radio. "We've just got to wait for him to strengthen up. I think we could find a nice Group One mile race somewhere for him."

Lightning return for Redzel

Top-class sprinter Redzel (Snitzel) will return to action in the Black Caviar Lightning Stakes (Gr 1, 1000m) at Flemington on 17 February. Co-trainer Peter Snowden added that the last-start Darley Classic (registered as VRC Stakes) (Gr 1, 1200m) winner could have a barrier trial at Rosehill next Monday. "He'll have one trial, maybe next Monday at Rosehill, and then another one at Flemington," Snowden told Racing.com. "It should set him up for the Lightning. 1000 metres down the straight suits him perfect. He loves Flemington. He's just a brilliant horse, it'll take a handy one to beat him."

Fancourt back from injury

Leading Queensland apprentice Alannah Fancourt is set to resume race riding after a long lay-off with injury. Fancourt has been among Brisbane's top apprentices for the past two years but broke her arm in a fall at Murwillumbah in August. She rode two winners at the Doomben barrier trials last week, and her manager Cameron Partington confirmed she is set to resume at Ipswich tomorrow. "She has one ride on Wednesday at Ipswich, a couple on Friday and hopefully more at the weekend," Partington said.

Parr sidelined

Sydney jockey Josh Parr will not ride until Friday at the earliest after being stood down last week due to dehydration. Parr was forced to forego rides at Gosford last Thursday and admitted to hospital last Friday, again forcing him to relinquish his rides at Randwick on Saturday. Parr has been stood down until Friday, when he is expected to take rides at Canterbury on Friday night.

Miller injured in Nowra fall

Canberra-based jockey Simon Miller fractured his hand in a race fall at Nowra yesterday. Miller was dislodged from the Matthew Smith-trained Typhoon Charlie (Myboycharlie) in race seven when the four-year-old appeared to clip heels shortly after entering the straight. He was taken to Nowra hospital complaining of a sore left wrist and was confirmed to have suffered a break after undergoing x-rays.

Monday-free racing trial starts

A trial of Monday-free racing in Victoria began yesterday, with no race meetings to be held in the state on a Monday for the next two and a half months while extra meetings will be staged on Wednesday evenings. "This initiative is a first for racing in Victoria and one which will assist us in future decision-making around the use of twilights and our customers' preferences," Racing Victoria's racing operations manager Paul Bloodworth said. "Due to the success of our night racing programme and the significant turnover growth created by double-header Thursdays and Fridays, we are confident this trial period will be a success."

Heat forces Victorian meeting changes

Racing Victoria yesterday brought forward Thursday's Kilmore racing meeting due to forecast high temperatures, with the first race to start at 10.50am. On the same day, the Pakenham race meeting has been pushed back to a 6.30pm start in a bid to beat the heat. Ararat's meeting scheduled for Friday has been delayed until Sunday.

Sensei to Telegraph

Co-trainer Michael Pitman has confirmed that talented three-year-old Sensei (Dream Ahead) will back up in the Telegraph Stakes (Gr 1, 1200m) at Trentham on Saturday. The colt ran eighth in the Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) three days ago but has reportedly emerged from that race in good shape. "Danielle Johnson will be riding him," said Pitman, who trains in partnership with his son Matthew. "He's bounced through his run the other day very well and we wouldn't be backing him up unless we thought he was a serious winning chance."

Bowman to ride Al Hasa

Leading jockey Hugh Bowman will ride Al Hasa (Exceed And Excel) in the Karaka Million (RL, 1200m) at Eilerslie, one of five runners Te Akau Racing

will have in the race. Stable jockey Opie Bosson has chosen unbeaten filly Avantage (Fastnet Rock) as his mount in the NZ\$1,000,000 race for two-year-olds at Ellerslie on 27 January and has committed to riding at 54.5 kilograms. "We've got five horses qualified for the Karaka Million and Opie has chosen Avantage," Te Akau Racing boss David Ellis said. "I asked him if he could do 54.5 kilograms and he said he'll do it easily. We've also got Hugh Bowman coming over to ride Al Hasa, Michael McNab will ride Sword Of Osman and Cameron Lammas is on Pinot Grey. We've still got to finalise a rider for The Real Beel."

Group targets for Julius

Cambridge trainer John Bell has Group-race targets in mind for the progressive sprinter Julius (Swiss Ace). The six-year-old ran out a comfortable winner over 1200 metres at Ellerslie on Sunday and is likely to be aimed towards the Concorde Handicap (Gr 3, 1200m) at Ellerslie on Saturday week and the Darley Plate (Gr 3, 1200m) at the same track on 3 March. "He's a Group horse, most definitely," Bell said. "We'll look at the Concorde and the Darley and plan around those races."

Herbie Dyke goal for Wait A Sec

Wait A Sec (Postponed) is likely to be aimed towards the Herbie Dyke Stakes (Gr 1, 2000m) at Te Rapa on 10 February, co-trainer Grant Cullen has confirmed. The seven-year-old ran out a narrow winner of the Anniversary Stakes (Gr 3, 1600m) on Saturday and will have his next outing in the Taranaki Cup (Gr 3, 1800m) at Pukekura on 3 February. "His next start will be in the Taranaki Cup and, all going well, he'll back up the following Saturday in the Herbie Dyke Stakes," said Cullen, who trains with Guy Lowry. "It was a great finish (to the Anniversary) and we were pleased to come out on the right side of it."

Snow Secret retired

Group Three-placed mare Snow Secret (Sakhee's Secret) has been retired to stud. The Shaune Ritchie-trained six-year-old, who finished placed at stakes level on three occasions, was found to have chipped a fetlock after a recent Cambridge barrier trial. "She went a super trial at Cambridge recently, but she pulled up a bit short and x-rays showed two very small chips in her front fetlock," Ritchie said. "We didn't want to risk her and we feel she's done her job and warrants her place at stud."

Talented Formidable sold overseas

Meanwhile, Ritchie has lost another talented performer in Formidable (Shocking), with the three-year-old set to continue his career in Hong Kong. The gelding took out the Salver Stakes (Listed, 2100m) at his last start in December and is due to travel to Asia tomorrow. "He's been bought by Stuart Hale Bloodstock and he's in quarantine and will be heading to Hong Kong on Wednesday," said Ritchie, who part-owned the gelding. "It's a bit of a shame, but it's the same old dance and the money was too good to turn down."

Karaka Sale preview on Sky tonight

A preview of the upcoming New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale hosted by Caroline Searcy will air tonight at 7pm (Australian EDT) on Sky Thoroughbred Central. Searcy travelled to seven leading New Zealand farms, including Waikato Stud and Cambridge Stud, in the making of the preview, which will present a collection of bluebloods and potential bargains ahead of the sale at Karaka later this month.

Asia

Top-class entries for Stewards' Cup

Time Warp (Archipenko), the last-start winner of the prestigious Hong Kong Cup (Gr 1, 2000m), is one of 13 runners entered for a potentially top-class renewal of the Stewards' Cup (Gr 1, 1600m) at Sha Tin on 28 January. The Tony Cruz-trained gelding could face multiple Group One winner Werther (Tavistock) again in the HK\$10,000,000 race, which is the first leg of the 2017-18 Hong Kong Triple Crown. Beauty Generation (Road To Rock) and Beauty Only (Holy Roman Emperor), the last two winners of the Hong Kong Mile (Gr 1, 1600m), and the progressive five-year-old Seasons Bloom (Captain Sonador) have also been nominated. Eight entries received for Sprint Cup

The John Size-trained Mr Stunning (Exceed And Excel) heads eight entries for the Centenary Sprint Cup (Gr 1, 1200m) at Sha Tin on the same card. The Australian-bred gelding took out the Hong Kong Sprint (Gr 1, 1200m) at his last start on 10 December to take his career record to ten wins

from 16 starts. Fellow Group One winner Lucky Bubbles (Sebring) has also been nominated for the HK\$10,000,000 sprint alongside D B Pin (Darci Brahma), who was narrowly touched off by Mr Stunning in the Hong Kong Sprint last month. [Click here](#) to view the entries.

Ascot receives prize money boost

Prize money at Ascot this year will pass £13,000,000 for the first time, with more than £7,000,000 on offer at the Royal meeting in June. The annual figure of £13,452,000 represents a ten per cent rise on last year, while the total purse for the five-day Royal Ascot fixture has also risen by ten per cent to £7,305,000. Ascot director of racing Nick Smith said: "Our total prize money this year is over £13,000,000 for the first time, with Royal Ascot well over £7,000,000, which are important milestones. This has been important in terms of maintaining the international appeal of Royal Ascot and the King George."

Faatinah entered at Meydan

The Lindsay Park-trained Group Two winner Faatinah (Nicconi) has been entered for a 1200 metre handicap at Meydan on Thursday. The five-year-old gelding, whose latest success came in the Bobbie Lewis Quality (Gr 2, 1200m) in September 2016, has been allotted top weight of 60 kilograms for the US\$135,000 sprint, for which 19 entries have been received. Also entered is the Mike de Kock-trained Grade Two winner Junoobi (Silvano) and the Godolphin-raced Baccarat (Dutch Art). [Click here](#) to view the entries.

Asmussen puts finishing touches to Gun Runner

American Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen was pleased with Gun Runner's (Candy Ride) final serious piece of work before his tilt at the Pegasus World Cup (Gr 1, 9f) at Gulfstream on 27 January. The last start Breeders' Cup Classic (Gr 1, 10f) winner worked over six furlongs at Fair Grounds in New Orleans on Sunday and is due to retire to stud after his run in the US\$16,000,000 race. "He's an amazing horse and I thought that he went beautiful today," Asmussen said. "I'm very appreciative of (track manager) Pedro Zavala and (director of racing) Jason Boulet. The racetrack was in just pristine, perfect condition for a work that we felt was this important."

Cape Premier Yearling Sale bosses hopeful of attracting HKJC money

South African hopes are high that the Hong Kong Jockey Club will be buying in significant numbers at this weekend's CTS Cape Premier Yearling Sale in Cape Town.

It is believed that this will be a consequence of Hong Kong's fallout with Australia and will result in Hong Kong becoming major buyers in the South African market. More importantly for the local breeding industry, it could lead to an end of the African Horse Sickness restrictions that have isolated the country's racing and bloodstock industries from the rest of the world.

CTS boss Wehann Smith said: "We're fully aware of what is going on between the Hong Kong Jockey Club and the Australian authorities, and the fact that the former has decided to boycott the Magic Millions sale.

"I can confirm that the Hong Kong Jockey Club people are here in Cape Town and that it's the first time that they are attending our sale. We're obviously extremely excited given our efforts at internationalising the sale.

"However it would be presumptuous for us to say that they're going to be buying horses. We are, though, extremely hopeful and we're looking forward to the sale."

The Australian government suspended the movement of horses from Hong Kong to Australia just over three months ago. As a result Hong Kong horses can no longer be sent to Australia to race - unless they serve 180 days quarantine in New Zealand - and nor can Australian horses run in Hong Kong's big international races.

Hong Kong is the main international supporter of South Africa's drive to bring its horses back onto the international scene - at present they have to quarantine in Mauritius for three months.

Last year the HKJC's chief executive Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges said: "We have a major ambition to open up South Africa to be part of a wider international scene and one of our clear targets is that within the next two years we are able to find quarantine solutions with them."

The CTS sale needs the Hong Kong input because, for the first time in many years, Markus Jooste will not be buying yearlings. The former Steinhoff chief executive has been the biggest buyer at the sale but is in the process of selling his bloodstock interests.

The Magic of the Millions



The sun has set on the highest grossing yearling sale ever conducted in the Southern Hemisphere and there is plenty to take away from the Magic Millions, with the Gold Coast carnival setting the scene for a bumper year for the Australasian bloodstock industry.

While Sunlight (Zoustar) was undoubtedly the star of the Magic Millions race day with a brilliant victory in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m), it was Yarraman Park Stud's stallion I Am Invincible (Invincible Spirit) who was the sire of the moment across the road at the yearling sales.

Having started from a modest \$11,000 service fee in 2010, when he was covering mostly modestly-performed bush mares, I Am Invincible's remarkable rise over eight years saw him produce multiple \$1,000,000 lots and the sale-topping \$2,000,000 colt at last week's sale.

Arthur and Harry Mitchell's decision to take a punt on I Am Invincible and stand him at Yarraman Park Stud is paying off. At last week's sale, I Am Invincible had 37 yearlings sell for \$17,710,000 at an average of \$478,649, figures

rivalled only by Snitzel (Redoute's Choice) and, to perhaps a lesser extent, Fastnet Rock (Danehill).

Snitzel had 33 yearlings sell for \$15,965,000 at an average of \$483,788, while Fastnet Rock's yearlings hit the \$1,000,000 milestone and averaged \$340,000 from 28 sold.

The deeds of I Am Invincible have been on display for a number of years, but on the back of an increase in mare quality, 2018 signalled I Am Invincible as a possible challenger to champion stallion Snitzel for the title in years to come. Time will tell, but watching I Am Invincible's likely continued upward trajectory will be fascinating.

All the 'big players', James Harron Bloodstock, Jon Kelly, Reg Inglis and Paul Frampton, as well as Damion Flower went past \$1,000,000 to land their chosen 'stallion prospects' by I Am Invincible.

The bidding for the I Am Invincible colts, and his fillies for that matter, typified what transpired through four furious days of selling at the Gold Coast complex, where buyers and agents were often forced to go one, two and three bids beyond what they had intended. Failure to go that extra mile usually meant bidders walked away with nothing other than a beachside summer holiday on the Gold Coast.

Before the sale, it was revealed prominent buyers Shadwell, the Hong Kong Jockey Club and US agent John Moynihan would not be participating at the Magic Millions this year.

Outgoing Magic Millions managing director Vin Cox admitted at the time it was disappointing the trio had chosen against buying at the Gold Coast, all for different reasons.

What impact the absence of the trio would have on the sale was hard to predict, but others stepped up to take their place, with 694 book one yearlings selling for an aggregate of \$156,727,000, a figure that comfortably surpasses the previous high of \$150,159,000 achieved at the 2008 Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale.

Godolphin, whom Cox is set to take charge

of from later this month, stepped into the Australian yearling market for the first time in a decade, purchasing eight yearlings for \$2,995,000 at an average of \$374,375.

The move was welcomed by breeders and vendors, with the international organisation supporting progeny by their own stallions, including Dawn Approach (New Approach), as well as buying yearlings by stallions such as Snitzel and Not A Single Doubt (Redoute's Choice). The change in policy from Godolphin is expected to continue throughout the Australian yearling sales.

The Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale was also a pointer towards stables to follow in the next few years, with the strength of Peter and Paul Snowden only expected to grow, mainly thanks to the support of China Horse Club and James Harron Bloodstock. The majority of the best-bred colts at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale are heading to the Snowdens' stable.

Harron, meanwhile, purchased ten yearlings for his colts syndicate at an average of \$724,000, with all to be trained by the Snowdens, cementing his place as one of Australia's leading bloodstock agents and one who is not afraid to back his judgment by going all out to get the horses he wants.

Gai Waterhouse and training partner Adrian Bott are not going away either, purchasing 27 yearlings as well as a number of other high-priced prospects including the sale-topping I Am Invincible colt and a sister to Group One winner Sweet Idea (Snitzel).

is also set to continue his rapid rise up the Sydney training ranks with the backing of owner Damion Flower, while Sunlight's trainer Tony McEvoy's determination to be in the top echelon of Australian stables was evident on the Gold Coast with his spending spree.

McEvoy purchased 17 yearlings for a total of \$5,005,000, including Sunlight's sister for \$600,000.

John O'Shea, who is now firmly back entrenched at Randwick after a three-year stint at Godolphin, also appears to be assembling a quality team of young horses. Ironically, O'Shea now has Tom Magnier in his corner, with the Coolmore Australia chief backing the Group One-winning trainer by securing a Fastnet Rock colt for \$1,000,000 in partnership on day one of the sale.

Meanwhile, the decision by Shadwell to overlook the Magic Millions seemingly did not have a detrimental effect on the overall sale, but

it will be interesting to see what impact, if any, it will have on Lindsay Park when the new season juvenile races start next October.

Last year, Shadwell purchased seven yearlings at an average of \$326,667, with Lindsay Park the beneficiary and the David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig training partnership has been a dominant force in the two-year-old training ranks, particularly in its home state of Victoria, in recent years.

Almost 300 lots offered in book one of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale were made up of yearlings by first season stallions and the market determined which ones it believes are most likely to succeed.

Last year, the progeny of Zoustar (Northern Meteor) were obvious and he was the leading freshman stallion at the sales, but this year there was a wide array of well-credentialed first season stallions.

Deep Field (Northern Meteor) had numbers on his side, but buyers pinned their faith in the Newgate Farm-based stallion, with 39 yearlings sold to a top \$675,000, while fellow resident first crop sire Dissident (Sebring) had 35 yearlings sell to a top of \$525,000.

Coolmore Stud's first crop sire Rubick (Encosta De Lago) was also singled out by buyers, with one of his 23 yearlings to sell reaching \$470,000.

By every measure, the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale was a resounding success and the fireworks are likely to continue, firstly at the New Zealand Bloodstock Karaka Yearling Sale in New Zealand later this month before the show rolls on, ushering in a new era with the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale at Riverside Stables to start on 10 February.

First Australian winner for Declaration Of War

Former Coolmore shuttler Declaration Of War (War Front) sired his first Australian winner on Thursday when Declarationofheart (2 c ex Cardiac by Encosta De Lago) made a winning debut over 1130 metres at Geelong. The Anthony Freedman-trained colt, who fetched NZ\$135,000 at the New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale and is from the family of VRC Oaks (Gr 1, 2500m) winner Arapaho Miss (Danehill Dancer), beat Okay Boss (Street Boss) by a length and three quarters under Mark Zahra. Declaration Of War will stand for a fee of US\$25,000 at Coolmore's Ashford Stud this year.

First for Fighting Sun

Sun Stud first season stallion Fighting Sun (Northern Meteor) sired his first winner on Saturday when Platinum Mam'selle (2 f ex Miss Fascination by Redoute's Choice) won on her second start at Trentham. The Lisa Latta-trained filly won the 2YO Premier (1200m) by a short neck over Boy Next Door (Showcasing). Platinum Mam'selle was an \$80,000 purchase by Beamish Bloodstock from the Woodside Park Stud draft at last year's Magic Millions Adelaide Yearling Sale. Fighting Sun was undefeated in two starts including in the Canonbury Stakes (Listed, 1100m) before being retired due to injury.

Two for Sizzling

Sizzling Belle (2 f ex Greenmount Belle by Magic Albert) made a winning debut over 1000 metres at Wagga on Friday to provide Newgate Farm-based first season sire Sizzling (Snitzel) with his second winner. The Nick Olive-trained filly, who was purchased for \$50,000 from the draft of Element Hill at the Magic Millions National Yearling Sale, beat The Chaplain (Zariz) by two and three quarter lengths. Sizzling stood

for a fee of \$16,500 (inc GST) last year and his other winner is the Angela Plumb-trained filly Sugar Sizzle.

First for Zoustar

First season stallion Zoustar (Northern Meteor) sired his first stakes winner on Saturday when the Tony McEvoy-trained Sunlight (2 f ex Solar Charged by Charge Forward) ran out an impressive winner of the Magic Millions 2YO Classic (RL, 1200m) at the Gold Coast. The two-year-old filly showed a smart turn of foot to beat Fullazaboot (Sepoy) by two lengths in the \$2,000,000 race. Sunlight is the only winner to date for her sire Zoustar, who stands on a year-by-year basis at Widden Stud in the Hunter Valley and at Woodside Park Stud in Victoria, and he is expected to return to Widden Stud in 2018.

New Group One winners

Fastnet Rock - Coolmore stallion Fastnet Rock (Danehill) sired his 32nd Group One winner and 126th stakes winner on Saturday when the Stephen Autridge and Jamie Richards-trained Age Of Fire (3 c ex Dragon's Tail by Galileo) took out the Levin Classic (Gr 1, 1600m) at Trentham. Fastnet Rock had one lot make seven figures at this year's Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling sale, after Coolmore paid \$1,000,000 for a colt from the Element Hill draft.

New stakes winners

Arch - The Jerry Hollendorfer-trained Instilled Regard (3 c ex Enhancing by Forestry) ran out an impressive winner of the LeComte Stakes (Gr 3, 8.5f) at Fair Grounds in New Orleans on Saturday and in the process provided his late sire Arch (Kris S) with his 63rd stakes winner. Arch died at the age of 21 in January 2016.

Choisir - Sir Frenchie (3 g ex Volando by Viscount) won the Fairview Wines Sophomore

Sprint (Listed, 1200m) at Kenilworth in South Africa on Saturday to become the 87th stakes winner for his sire Choisir (Danehill Dancer). Choisir had 14 yearlings sell for a total of \$2,120,000 and an average of \$151,429 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale.

Empire Maker - The Masaru Honda-trained Eterna Minoru (5 m ex Daiwa Gelato by Fuji Kiseki) ran out a ready winner of the Aichi Hai (Gr 3, 2000m) at Chukyo on Saturday and in the process provided Empire Maker (Unbridled) with his 57th stakes winner. Empire Maker stands at Gainesway Stud in Kentucky and his fee in 2018 will be US\$85,000.

So You Think - Former reverse shuttler So You Think (High Chaparral) sired his fifth stakes winner on Saturday courtesy of Care To Think's (4 g ex Slippery Madam by Hussonet) win in the Magic Millions Cup (RL, 1400m) at the Gold Coast. So You Think ceased shuttling in 2014 and stands exclusively at Coolmore Australia in the Hunter Valley. He stood for a fee of \$60,500 (inc GST) last year.

Uncle Mo - After a fine third place finish in the La Brea Stakes (Gr 1, 7f) at Santa Anita, Mopotism (4 m ex Peppy Rafaela by Bernardini) finally broke through at stakes level when she took out the La Canada Stakes (Gr 2, 8f) at the same track on Saturday and in the process provided her sire Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) with his 37th stakes winner. Uncle Mo will stand for a fee of US\$125,000 at Ashford Stud this year.

Written Tycoon - The David Miller-trained Overplay (3 c ex Darcenell by Tailings) caused an upset at odds of \$26 in the Tasmanian Guineas (Listed, 1600m) at Hobart on Friday, providing Written Tycoon (Iglesia) with his 22nd stakes winner. Woodside Park Stud-based Written Tycoon had 23 yearlings sell for a total aggregate of \$6,415,000 at the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale last week, with a top lot of \$625,000.

Ladies day in the sun ... the magic of racehorse ownership

Racetrack success can be measured in many ways. Times. Margins. Group victories. Prizemoney.

But then there is the intangible. The sheer emotion - the thrill - of owning the winner of a \$2 million race.

Few get to experience it, but therein is the allure. The Grail trail.

Katie Thompson and her fellow, female owners of Sunlight certainly got to experience it on Saturday when their filly captured the Magic Millions 2YO Classic over 1200m on the Gold Coast.

Despite the hot sun - literally and figuratively - thousands had packed into the Gold Coast racecourse, with many, many thousands more watching (enviously) on telly.

Leading into Saturday's race, Sunlight had won two of three outings: finishing third on debut in the Listed Maribyrnong Plate at Flemington in October before resuming on the Gold Coast in December with a five length scamper over 900m and, in an ideal leadup, was equally dominant over 1100m there on 6 January. Both Gold Coast wins were class records.

Sure, barrier 12 for the Magic Millions 2YO Classic might not have been the best of draws, but Sunlight was still sent out a marginal favourite ahead of the (previously) unbeaten pair of Ef Troop and Jonker.

Although Ef Troop was the tearaway leader from the jump, Sunlight loomed shortly after turning for home and, in a matter of strides, it

was all over bar the shouting. And shout they did.

What a tremendous advertisement for racehorse ownership this is. Katie Page, wife of Magic Millions principal, Gerry Harvey, initiated a bonus in 2012 whereby connections of the first four 'all female owned or leased horses' past the post in the 2YO Classic would receive a share of \$500,000 ... \$325,000 for first.

It has inspired the formation of a large number of female owned horses: most notably the dual Group One winner, Global Glamour (by Star Witness), that is raced by 40 women from seven countries.

And it inspired Katie Thompson too,

although it could be said she has a closer connection to Sunlight than most.

Sunlight from early days, as the filly - a daughter of Widden's resident stallion, Zoustar - was foaled down at their property.

"I didn't have a great deal to do with Sunlight before she was prepped for the (2017) Gold Coast Magic Millions, but she was always a lovely type and had this real attitude about her," Thompson reveals. "She can get a bit feisty alright."

"After Tony (McEvoy) purchased her for \$300,000 with Julian Blaxland and Aquis Farm, a few of us decided to keep a share. We've long had a close association with Sheikh Fahad Al Thani and Qatar Racing, co-breeders of Sunlight, so his assistant racing manager, Hannah Wall, is a shareholder: in fact, Antony and Sheikh Fahad's bloodstock manager, David Redvers, purchased Sunlight's dam, Solar Charged, from the 2014 Magic Millions Broodmare Sale.

"Another co-breeder in Dan Fletcher is from Emerald in Queensland and has been a very good client of Widden's over the years, so he put in his wife and daughter, while Tony Fung's wife, Loretta, is a shareholder as well, along with a couple of Tony McEvoy's clients.

"It's a nice, little group and been a great ride so far."

Definitely a day Thompson won't forget in a hurry ...

"It was one of those times when you wish the day was 12 hours longer," Thompson points out. "After the races, Widden sold a Snitzel filly for \$1.1 million, capping off a brilliant week."

Two days prior to the big race, McEvoy had purchased the full sister to Sunlight from Widden for \$600,000 and Thompson explains that the same ownership group will race this youngster too.

"She (the yearling) is very much in the mould of her big sister," Thompson adds. "Similar conformation and the same kind of attitude. Hopefully lightning can strike twice."

Sunlight will now seek to emulate 2016 Magic Millions 2YO Classic winner, Capitalist, who went on to capture the \$3.5 million Golden Slipper,

but will first have a few more "swims" in Queensland before heading for a short break in the paddock.

Win, lose or draw come Slipper day, Sunlight has proven to be a tremendous launching pad for her sire, Zoustar, according to Thompson: "To win a race of this stature with your first crop is amazing ... we were confident the Zoustars would develop into really nice 3YOs but to get such a good winner this early from only a handful of runners ... well, that's pretty special.

"Hopefully he can emulate his sire (Northern Meteor) and grandsire (Encosta de Lago) by becoming Champion Australian First Season Sire."

Manoel Nunes back with a double

Six-time Macau Champion jockey Manoel Nunes got off to a flying start on his first day back in the enclave on Friday night with a winning double to herald his return.

Nunes, who is arguably the most popular jockey in the Club's history, received a big Macau welcome from his fans as he bought the first of his winners Fantastic Destiny (Ekraar) back to scale. Nunes rode the perfect race on the Joe Lau-trained gelding after copping a check in the early part of the race.

Rain in the early part of the week left the turf surface in a yielding to soft state. Even with the rail out eight metres, the inside was noticeably more cut up from recent racing as opposed to the rarely used outside section of the track. Ever the professional, Nunes inspected the track on Thursday evening and concluded that the outside was the better place to be given Fantastic Destiny's poor wet track record.

After putting the five-year-old gelding in a midfield position as the field raced into the back straight, Nunes slowly angled away from the rails approaching the home turn to place the horse in the centre of the track on straightening. Fantastic Destiny ran home strongly to beat Easy Thai (Haradasun) in the 1500 metre Class 6 contest, with Superlative Choice (Hidden Dragon) close up in third.

The new Australian import Eastern Paradise (Foxwedge) was the second of Nunes' winners in the Class 2 Handicap (1350m) for trainer Victor Chan, in a run that impressed the jockey greatly. Nunes showed perfect balance after the saddle shifted and the girth slipped back almost to the horse's flanks. That did not deter the champion rider and he continued to ride the horse right out to the line even changing the whip from left to right hand.

"I'm so glad to be back in Macau one hundred percent," he said.

"Macau is home to me nowadays my family and my home are here.

"I have so many friends from the nine years I was here before, so I'm very happy how it has all worked out."

Nunes was full of praise for Eastern Paradise after the win and predicts a nice future for the horse.

"He is still learning even though he raced and won overseas," Nunes continued.

"I don't think he likes too much kickback and I had to keep him going a bit through the run he wanted to switch off.

"Then of course the girth slipped right back to his flanks so it was a bit more difficult to ride him out.

"It was also good to win on Fantastic Destiny for my good friend Joe Lau as well."

No 42 years old, Nunes is in Macau for a six month contract initially and then will decide his next step.

"I really enjoyed my five years in Singapore but it's great to be back with family and old friends."

Nunes is the most successful jockey in the Club's history with close to 850 Macau winners alone. His career stats as of 12 November last year read a total 10,824 race rides for 1818 winners. He has ridden 57 Group or Graded race winners and a total of 70 Listed winners.

As well as being six times Champion Macau jockey, Nunes won three straight Singapore titles and was runner-up twice. Once behind

Joao Moreira in his first season and he was again second to Vlad Duric last season.

The very promising Luen On Eagle (Stryker) made it two wins from his two starts with another easy victory in Friday night's Class 4 over 1200 metres on the turf.

Ridden by Andrew Calder, Luen On Eagle parked on the back of the speedy Chapman Way (Strategic Maneuver) until the top of the straight, before rolling on by of him to race away for an impressive win.

A three-year-old created a huge impression on debut when he burst away from his wide barrier to lead and romp in over 1200 metres on a good track. Friday night's win on the soft ground shows his versatility, and judging by his sand trials he appears as though he will handle the all weather track just as well.

"That was another good win," Calder said

"He is a very promising horse. Good action and size about him, and he is not completely tightened up yet."

Luen On Eagle is prepared by Geoff Allendorf for his long term clients Thomas Lau Pong Sing and well known Australian Central Coast racing identity Colin Keane.

The gelding has been a bargain for his owners costing only \$36,000 at the Inglis Ready 2 Race Sale in 2016, and is another success story from the MJC's Online Sales Concept.
